Pokso Does Not Like His Cheeks Pinched



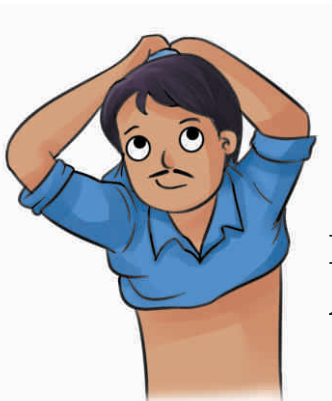
I **do not like** when someone pulls or pinches my cheeks.
