In it, the letter 'B' is represented by the word 'Bravo', while the letter 'P' is represented by the word 'Papa' and so on. Here are the letters in the NATO phonetic alphabet:

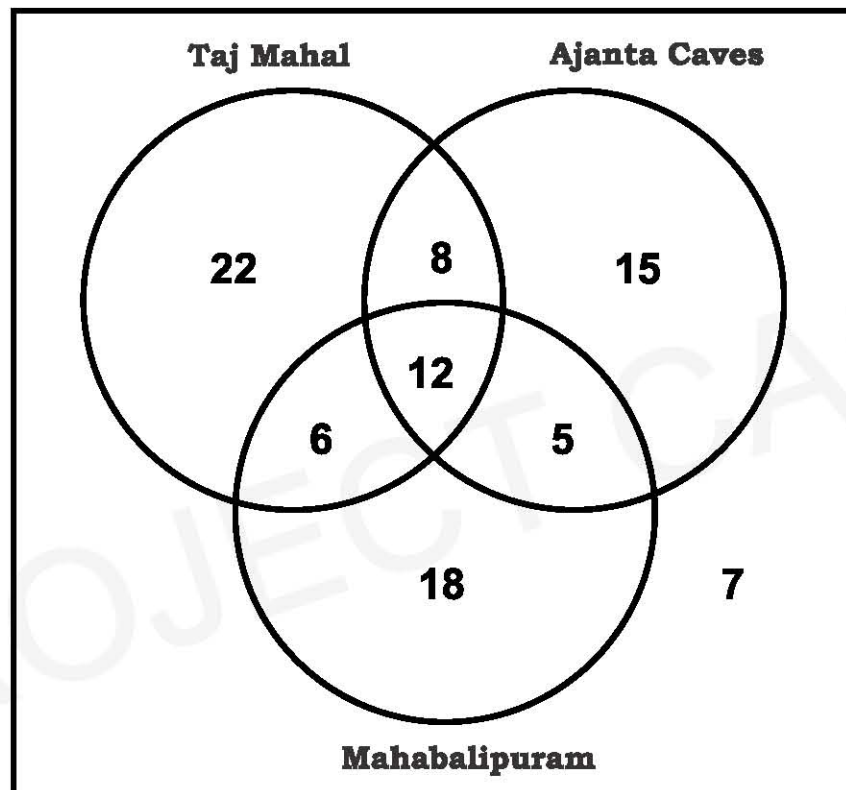
